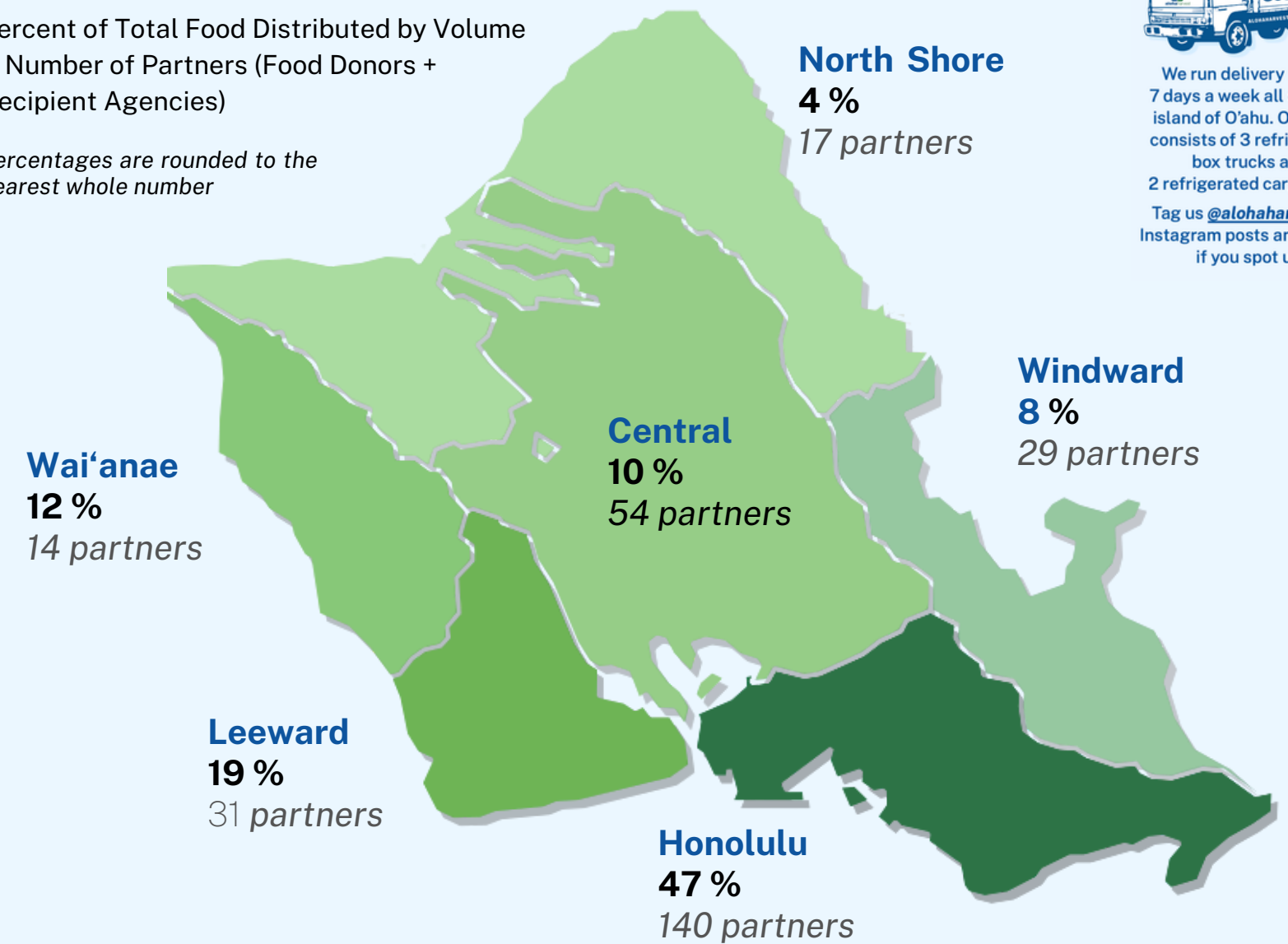

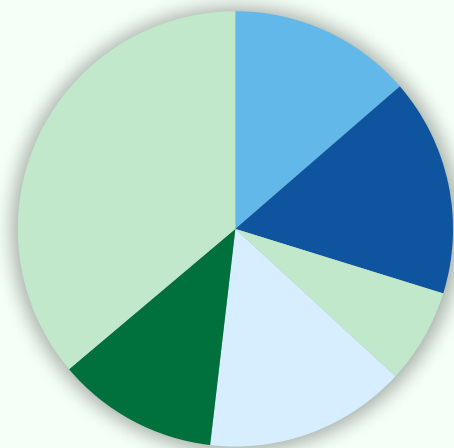

We have recurring and frequent needs for volunteers to help rescue excess food from special events like film sets, weddings, lū'aus, and bakeries.

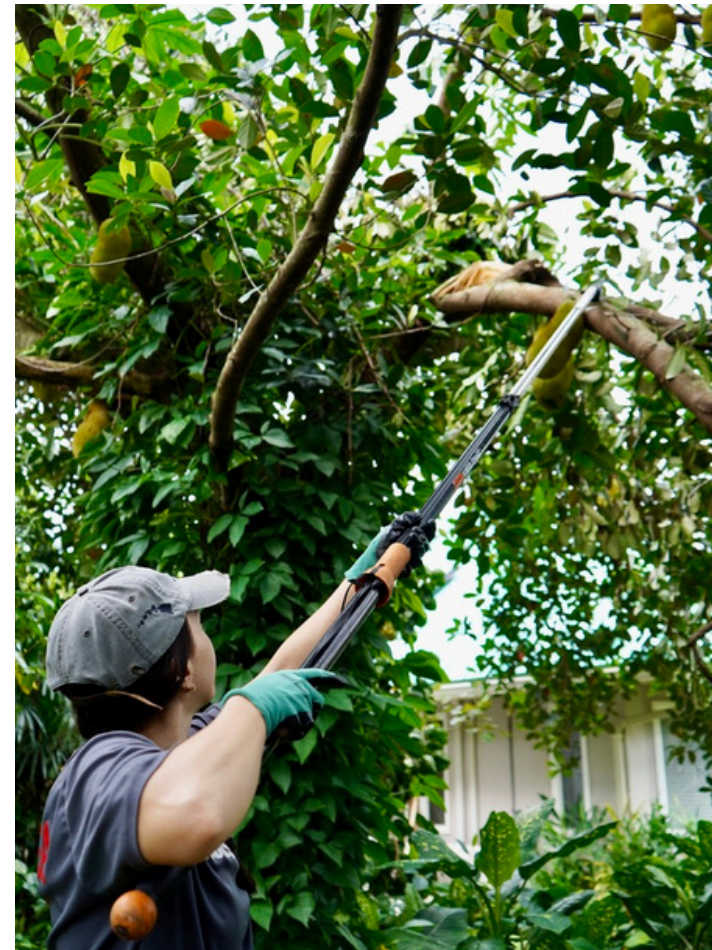

Rooted in Service: St. Timothy's Episcopal Church

For nearly two decades, St. Timothy's Episcopal Church in 'Aiea has been a steady source of care and connection for its community. Since first partnering with Aloha Harvest in 2007, the church has helped distribute more than 116,000 pounds of rescued food to individuals and families across Central O'ahu, ensuring that nourishment reaches those who need it most.

Maka'alamihī Gardens: A Place That Gives Back

Located in beautiful Kāne'ohe, Maka'alamihī Gardens is a flourishing home garden where abundance is part of everyday life. With a wide variety of fruit trees producing more than can be used, the garden has become an important source of fresh food for the broader community.

Since partnering with Aloha Harvest in 2021 through our Community Harvest program, Maka'alamihī Gardens has donated over 7,500 pounds of produce, including jackfruit, papaya, breadfruit, and more. With the help of dedicated volunteers, this partnership has transformed surplus harvests into nourishing food for local agencies and families across O'ahu.



“Working with AH has been a real game changer!” shared owner Stacy Evenson. “We have a large home garden and produce way more fruit than we can use. AH comes regularly with their trained volunteers to rescue the excess that would otherwise fall to the ground attracting rats and causing disease. Most importantly, AH takes the rescued produce immediately to food shelters and other sites in our community to feed those in need of fresh food. Because of AH, we are helping to address Hawaii’s food insecurity issue, if only in a small way, and that makes us feel very good.”

Fuel the *Rescue*

Help Aloha Harvest Get New Wheels!

Every day, Aloha Harvest is on the move - connecting surplus food with communities who need it most. Behind each successful pickup and delivery is a fleet of trucks that make this work possible. After years of constant use, these vehicles are starting to break down, having supported thousands of rescues all over the island.

To sustain and strengthen our operations, we are launching Fuel the Rescue, a campaign to raise \$120,000 to replace a critical delivery truck. This investment is key to maintaining the consistency and efficiency our partners depend on. On average, Aloha Harvest rescues 6,123 pounds of food each day, working with 137 donors and distributing to 101 recipient agencies every month. Each of these connections relies on dependable transportation to ensure food reaches our community safely and on time.

As demand for food access continues, so does the need for a strong and reliable fleet. A new truck will allow us to continue meeting this demand, expand our reach, and reduce disruptions caused by maintenance and breakdowns. More than just a vehicle, it represents the ability to keep food in motion - reducing waste while feeding our neighbors.

Through Fuel the Rescue, we **invite our community** to be part of this effort. We are so grateful to the individual donors who have already contributed \$1,424.55 to kickstart this campaign! Together, we can keep our wheels turning and our mission moving forward, ensuring that good food continues to nourish people across O'ahu.

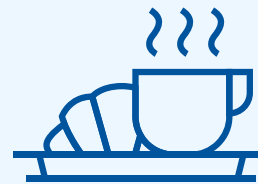

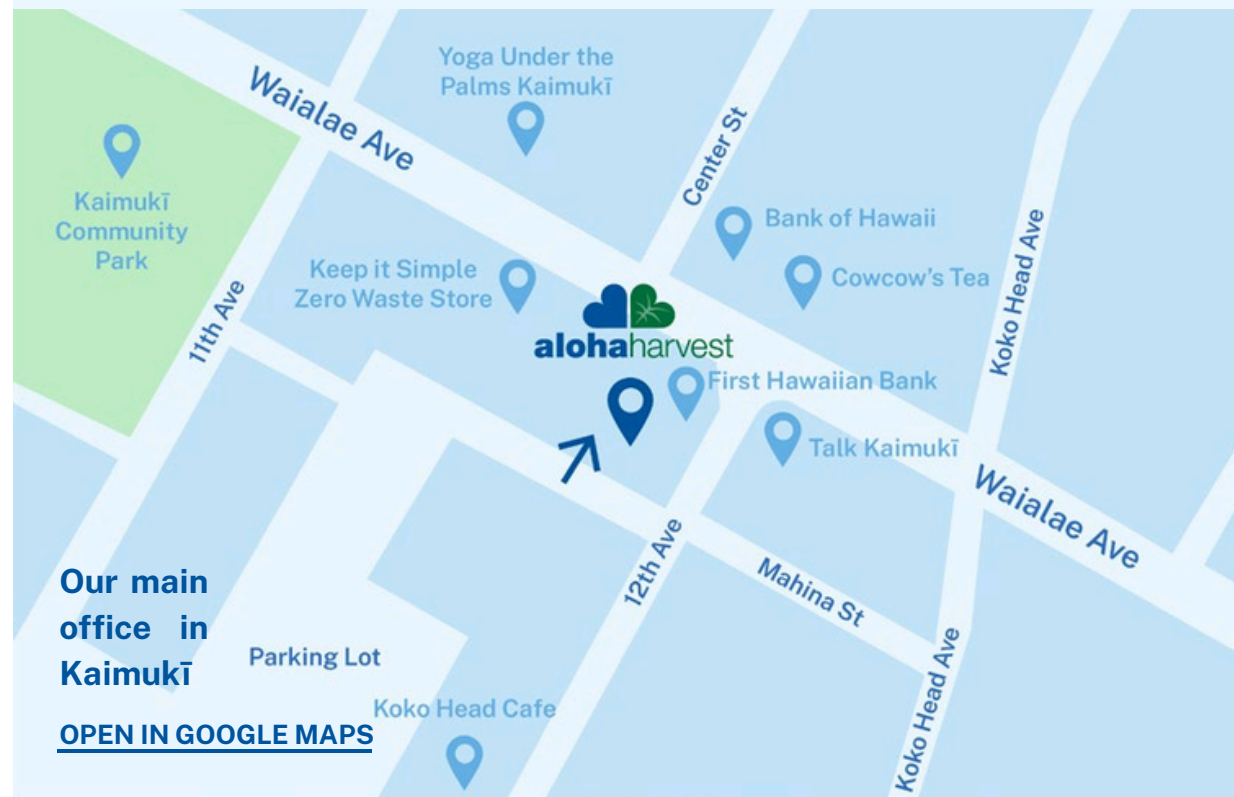
