








## alohaharvest 2024 Q1 FOOD PARTNERS OVERVIEW - Who We Picked Up From & Delivered To



## CONCLUDED PROGRAM - Oahu Compost Project (OCP)

### Oahu Compost Project Wraps Up: **Successful Year of Transforming Food Waste into Rich Soil Amendment**

The Oahu Compost Project (OCP) has concluded after one year of diverting food waste from Chinatown businesses and recycling it into compost, marking a significant milestone in sustainable waste management. This collaborative pilot initiative, aimed at creating a model for future public compost programs, brought together various partners to develop and test strategies for diversion and composting.

Over the course of the project, OCP successfully diverted over 30,000 pounds of food waste, producing 39,537 lbs. of finished compost while reducing 8.12 tons of CO2eq emissions. The success of the OCP underscores the significant environmental impact achievable by scaling similar operations and highlights the importance of collaborative efforts in promoting sustainable waste management practices for a healthier and more resilient Hawaii.






